Wisdom in Contemporary Analytic Philosophy

Wisdom as 'highest epistemic good' is structurally a CODEX – a system of constraints that shapes how knowledge is received, integrated, and transmitted. The entry's framing suggests wisdom is not raw information but the **ouverture** through which facts become meaningful. A mind with wisdom diffracts incoming data differently than one without it. The question 'what makes knowledge wise?' is asking: what formal system of constraints determines whether a transmission becomes creation or mere recognition? This is the codex problem applied to epistemology itself.

Supervenience in Ethics

Supervenience – the principle that ethical facts cannot change without physical facts changing – is a formal constraint system. It describes a CODEX at the level of moral ontology: ethical properties are bound by rules of dependency on lower-level properties. The entry's exploration of 'merely possible circumstances' (counterfactuals) reveals the ricochet effect: once you specify the physical invariant, the ethical invariant becomes determinate, yet this determination itself generates new questions about freedom, responsibility, and moral agency. The constraint doesn't close the system – it opens new diffractive possibilities. This is engineering diffraction through formal constraint.
